# **GET READY GUIDE**

### **☑** Be Financially Ready

Know your monthly budget and expenses and make a plan to meet those expenses as a retiree.

### **Your Pension**

If you have a defined benefit pension plan, get an up-to-date estimate of your pension and the income you can expect in retirement before you make the plunge. Many LIUNA affiliated pension plans require that you contact the Fund at least 3 months in advance of receiving benefits.

## **Social Security**

Check to see when you will be eligible for social security benefits and get a benefits estimate by contacting the Social Security Administration in advance of your retirement. To get benefits, you must file an application three months prior to retiring.

### Your Health Coverage and Medicare

Check on your eligibility to continue your health coverage and/or apply for Medicare Part A and Part B to take care of your health in retirement.

### Stay Involved in Your Union

Many LIUNA Local Unions have an active retiree program with scheduled meetings, events and activities for retirees. Don't miss out! Find out about your local retiree program and get involved.

### Keep in Touch

Make sure your pension fund, Local Union, and health insurance provider have current contact information for you.
